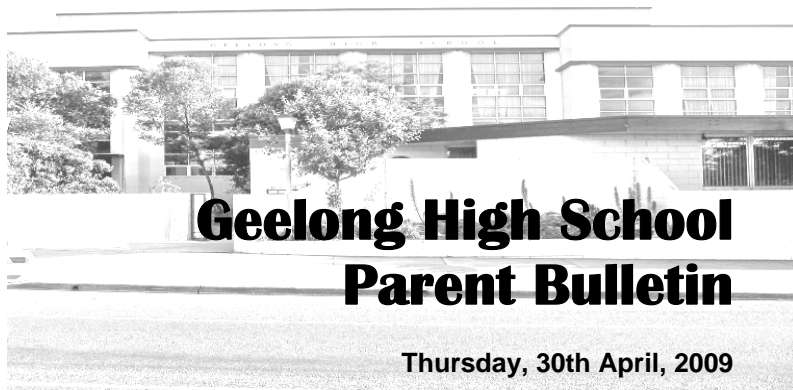

## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

### ANZAC Day Ceremony

A very moving and well coordinated ANZAC ceremony was conducted by the SRC last Thursday. I need to compliment our students on the organisation and running of this important event on the school's calendar, in particular our school captains and vice captains for the great job they did. I was also very pleased with the response of our students to the ceremony. Our guest speaker this year was Sergeant Simon Croxford from the Queenscliff Fort. He spoke highly of our students as well. Sergeant Croxford has many years of service in the army with overseas postings. His speech on the significance of ANZAC day was very engaging for our students. Matt Van Baar and Phil Hunter are also to be thanked for their military precision as part of the catafalque procession. As a follow-up to our ceremony two of our students attended the Geelong Schools' ANZAC ceremony held at Johnston Park on Friday. This again was a moving ceremony attended by Nick Hayward, Eliza Buckley and myself. As part of the program, each school that attended received a Lone Pine Seedling. This will be planted shortly in the school grounds once a suitable site has been found. It has the potential to grow into a very large tree.



### National School Pride Program

I'm very pleased to announce that the school has been successful in its application for \$200,000 in funding through the National School Pride program (NSP). These funds will be used to upgrade and expand our computer room facilities and shouldn't be confused with money received earlier this year to purchase new computers. Our computer rooms at the moment are well below an acceptable standard and are in urgent need of an upgrade so this funding is very timely. These works under the program need to be completed by the end of this school year.

## Uniform

I would like to thank the parents for their support in our recent uniform blitz. I'm very pleased to report that our uniform is being worn to a far higher standard by the majority of our students. There are still a number of issues that are to be addressed, in particular girls' socks and the wearing of hooded jumpers under school jumpers.

I have no issue if students wear jumpers under their school jumper for extra warmth as long as it is not visible. The wearing of hooded jumpers is not appropriate. With the turn in weather this has become an issue. Girls socks need to be above their ankles, not the anklet variety that has become popular. The girls can expect to be challenged in regard to this. Again I thank the parents for their assistance in applying these rules and expectations.

## Winstanley Building upgrade

At the moment we are looking at meeting with all three local members of parliament through School Council to give all School Council members the opportunity to ask questions and to state their views. Concept drawings are currently being prepared by local architectural firm SKM and Art/Technology staff are continuing discussions about various models for the area.

There will be more government funded places, and it is likely that more courses will be offered at each institution.

#### Aussie Rules Europe 2007 EU Cup – Hamburg 2007

In conjunction with Aussie Rules Europe, Germany will be hosting the 2007 EU Cup in Hamburg on September 15-16, 2007. Entry is open to all national Australian football teams based in Europe.

As with the inaugural EU Cup in London in 2005, the event will be played under the rules of 9-a-side football. The primary intention of this tournament is to showcase Aussie Rules with a reduction in the number of players, held on sporting fields that are readily found in nearly every corner of Europe; without any loss in the excitement, skill or quality of the 18-a-side version of our great game.

#### History of the Australian Football League Germany

The *Frankfurt Redbacks* and *Munich Kangaroos* were founded in 1995 and had been playing since 1996. The AFLG was officially created in 1999, but the two clubs only played occasional matches against each other for the first few years until the formation of the *Berlin Crocodiles* and the *Hamburg Dockers* made the possibility of a national league a reality. The German home and away season began in 2003 with these four clubs, Munich winning the premiership.

In 2004 the Düsseldorf Lions (formed in 2002) joined the AFLG, the league having a five-club structure for the following two seasons.

In 2006, a new French side from Strasbourg, the Kangaroos, entered the German league to experience regular league play. The Strasbourg club played under the nickname the "Black Devils" in the German league to avoid a name clash with Munich. At roughly the same time, the Düsseldorf club re-branded to become the *Rheinland Lions* to reflect a shared home between Düsseldorf and nearby Köln (Cologne).

In 2007 the French team, Strasbourg Kangaroos withdrew from the league to regain strength leaving five clubs and a 10-game league season plus additional tournaments.

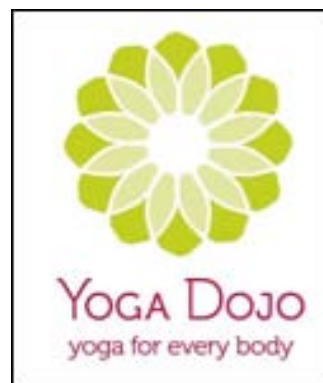
#### Central European League

Finland turned up to defend their crown, with teams from Austria, Croatia and Czech Republic all ready to battle it out for CEAFL bragging rights. Also on offer was the first leg of the 2007 Tri-Nations tournament, the Schnitzel Cup, played off between Austria, Croatia and Czech Republic.

After three years of training at the *Jesuitenwiese* (Prater) cow paddock we now have a dedicated training ground. From now on we train at the Austria Cricket Stadium. Day of training and Time remain the same (each Wednesday 18:30 - 20:30).
